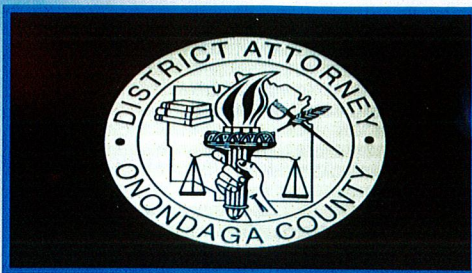


PROCEDURE

- A referral form must be completed by referring Court, Police Officer or School Official

Process

- ⇒ Eligibility is approved by Cyber Justice Program Coordinator
- ⇒ 2 separate classes (ages 11-13) & (ages 14-18)
- ⇒ Class location is the lower level of the Justice Center
- ⇒ Offender must attend entire class
- ⇒ Classes taught by Law Enforcement Officers and Assistant DA's
- ⇒ Fee may apply

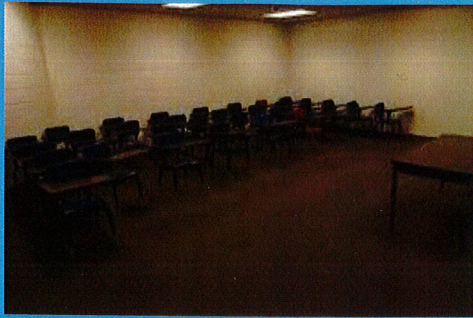

Vision Statement

To provide a diversionary program to teach youthful offenders about the legal and societal consequences of sexting and cyberbullying via the internet and other forms of electronic communication.

Eligibility

Youthful Offenders who could be charged with non-violent, low-level crimes involving the use of the internet and other forms of electronic communications.

Program Initiative

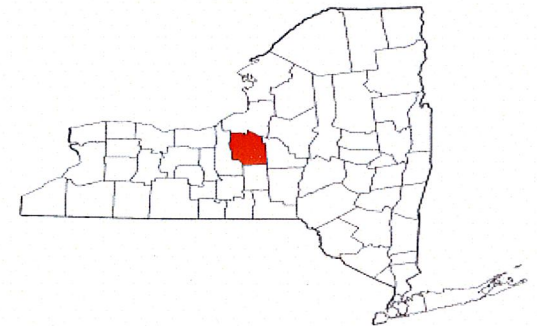
To provide youthful offenders with an opportunity to complete the diversion program to prevent future criminal ramifications.

Program Requirements

- School attendance
- Maintain passing grades
- Follow school policies/ rules
- Commit no additional crimes
- Attend the one day Cyber Justice class (Fee may apply)

Referrals

- Police agencies- in an exchange for reduced or dropped charges.
- Schools Officials- in conjunction with school's disciplinary policies and/ or in exchange for reduced or dropped disciplinary actions against the student.
- Court- as part of a negotiated disposition and/ or sentence
